CLUB HISTORY

The club was formed on 24 September 1898 as Manor Works, the works team of the Crittall Window Company, from which they gained their nickname Iron The new club took over the fixtures of the recently defunct Braintree F.C. in the North Essex League, and also took on most of the former club's players. They left the league in 1900 but returned in 1901. They won the title in 1905–06, 1910–11 and 1911–12, also winning the Mid-Essex League in 1909–10 and 1910–11. In 1911 they also joined Division 2A of the Essex & Suffolk Border League, remaining in the league until 1928.

In 1921 they were renamed Crittall Athletic to be more closely identified with their parent company. After winning Division Two (Western) in 1922–23 and 1923–24, they were promoted to the Senior Division of the Border League in 1925. In 1928 they joined the Spartan League, and in 1935 were founder members of the Eastern Counties League, although they also continued to play in the Border League. They won the Border League in 1935–36 and both the Border League and the Eastern Counties League in 1936–37, but then left the Eastern Counties League to join the newly established Essex County League. The new league folded after a single season (in which Crittall were runners-up) and the club returned to the Eastern Counties League.

After World War II the Eastern Counties League did not resume in 1945, so Crittall joined the Eastern Division of the London League instead. After finishing second in their first season, they were promoted to the Premier Division. They were invited to re-join the Eastern Counties League in 1947, but turned the offer down and remained in the London League, where they won the League Cup twice before returning to the Eastern Counties League in 1952. In 1954 they turned professional, but financial problems forced them to revert to amateur status and drop back down into the Border League at the end of the 1954–55 season.

In 1959–60 they won the league and League Cup double. They switched to the Greater London League in 1964, and then to the Metropolitan League in 1966. They were renamed Braintree & Crittall Athletic in 1968, and after winning the League Cup in 1969–70, the club returned to the Eastern Counties League again. In 1981 all links with Crittall were severed and the club was renamed Braintree F.C., before adopting their current name a year later. They won their second Eastern Counties League title in 1983–84 and retained it the following season. In 1986–87 they won the Essex Senior Trophy and the following season

they won the League Cup. In 1991 Braintree moved up to the Southern Division of the Southern League. In 1996 the club asked the FA to switch leagues to reduce their travelling. After initially being refused, they were allowed to move to Division Three of the Isthmian League, although it was an effective drop of two divisions. They were promoted as runners-up in their first season, and repeated the feat the following season. After three seasons in Division One they were promoted to the Premier Division with a third-place finish in 2000–01. They won the Premier Division in 2005–06 to earn promotion to the Conference South. The season also saw them reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, eventually losing 4–1 at Shrewsbury Town.

Braintree qualified for the promotion play-offs in their first season in the Conference South, but lost 1-0 to Salisbury City in the final. They also reached the play-offs the following season, but lost to Eastbourne Borough in the semi-finals. In 2010-11 they finished as Conference South champions, earning promotion to the Conference Premier. The next four seasons saw the club reach the FA Cup for the first round, losing to Tranmere Rovers, Newport County, Chesterfield and Oxford United in successive seasons. In 2015-16 they finished third in the renamed National League, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. Despite winning the first leg at Grimsby Town 1-0, they lost the home leg 2-0 after extra time. In 2016-17 the club reached the second round of the FA Cup for the first time after beating Eastbourne Borough in the first round; they eventually lost 5-2 to Millwall in the second round. They were relegated from the National League at the end of the season after finishing in the bottom four.

The 2017–18 season saw Braintree finish sixth in the National League South. In the play-offs they defeated Hemel Hempstead Town and Dartford to reach the final, in which they beat Hampton & Richmond Borough 4–3 on penalties to earn promotion back to the National League. However, they were relegated to the National League South the following season after finishing second-from-bottom of the National League. 2 seasons that followed saw major disruption owing to the covid pandemic, 2021–22 season was played to a finish and despite a tough period with 11 straight defeats the team with an increased playing budget were able to secure their place in the National League for this season.

Angelo Harrop was appointed as replacement for the departed Ryan Maxwell, and has had to practically rebuild the whole squad ahead of the season.

STAFF & PLAYER PROFILES

ANGELO HARROP - MANAGER

Ex Colchester United FC player, played for various non-league clubs prior to getting first job at Stanway rovers FC leading them to promotion and quarter final of the FA vase. Angelo lead his AFC Sudbury side to the first round of the FA cup in the 2022 season , this was the furthest Sudbury have ever gone in the

competition. This season our aim as a football club is to be very competitive in all the games we play in and build a strong energetic side for the coming seasons.

JACK SIMS Sims started his career with local side, Canvey Island before spending six years at Southend United and then eventually joining Blackpool as a 16-year old. Prior to making his Football League debut in December 2019, during a 1-0 defeat to Accrington

Stanley, replacing an injured Jak Alnwick with 60 minutes remaining, Sims enjoyed loan spells at both Skelmersdale United and Lancaster City between 2017 and 2019. At the conclusion of the 2020–21 campaign, Sims was released upon the expiry of his contract. In October 2021, he made the move to National League South side, Welling United and went onto 24 times in all competitions before joining Braintree Town ahead of the 2022–23 campaign.

DAMIAN NIEMCZYCKI oft 3 physically dominant goalkeeper who came through the youth system with Arsenal. Moved to Oxford United. Since leaving Oxford has played for Billericay, Merstham, VCD Athletic & Ashford Town.

KYRAN CLEMENTS Defender who is the longest serving player at the club, now enjoying his Fourth season at the club having joined back in 2019, the last remaining "Driver Survivor" was voted Supporters Player of the Year last season. Kyran combines playing alongside his role as Academy Player Care Officer for Ipswich Town. Previous clubs include Bury Town, AFC Sudbury & Leiston.

JOHN WHITE Defender who previously played in the Football League for Colchester United and Southend United, where he made over 200 league appearances for both sides.

BARIS ALTINTOP Started his career at Ipswich Town where he played from U9s to 14s. Baris would then go on to play for local teams Colchester United, before having his breakout season, which would come at the age of 19 at AFC Sudbury where he would later become first team captain then on to Bury town and kings Lynn. Described as a physically strong defender with a great mental attitude, always likely to win a header and a confident/aggressive all round player who can play in defence or midfield.

LEON DAVIES Davies was a Cambridge United youth graduate and earned himself a professional contract with Cambridge United. He made his first team debut on 30 August 2016 in a 1-0 EFL Trophy win against Shrewsbury Town. He made his League Two debut on 2 January 2017 coming on a substitute in a 4-0 win against Notts County, On 18 January 2019, Davies joined National League South side Bath City on loan for a month. He was offered a new contract by Cambridge United at the end of the 2018-19 season. During the off season Davies signed a new two-year contract with Cambridge keeping him at the club until the summer of 2021. On 29 November 2021, Davies joined National League side Weymouth on a one-month Ioan deal, On 11 January 2022, Davies joined National League side Southend United on a permanent deal until summer 2022. On 15 July 2022, Davies agreed to join fellow Essex-based side, Braintree Town ahead of the 2022-23 campaign.

KYRON FARRELL Farrell began his career with Millwall, signing a professional contract in May 2016. He moved on loan to Braintree Town in January 2017. On 15 June 2017, it was announced that Farrell would join National League South side Concord Rangers following his release from Millwall. He moved to Cray Wanderers in March 2018. He the 2018-19 season with Walton Casuals. Following a threeyear spell with Hampton & Richmond Borough, Farrell returned to Braintree Town in August 2022.

JOE MUSCATT A high energy box to box midfielder. Two footed and very technical. Came up through the Tottenham academy where played until under 23s. Then moved on to Bolton where made one senior appearance in

the championship. While at Bolton also went on loan to Salford for a number of games in the national league. After having a long spell out due to injury signed for SC Paderborn in Germany. Made debut for Malta national team in 2020. Last year played for Welling United and Billericay.

ALFIE PAYNE Alfie is a centre midfielder who started his footballing career at Norwich City FC progressing through the club from 8 years old to 20 and has been named on the bench in the championship for them. Since then, Alfie has played for Kings Lynn where a highlight was winning the National League North. He is now currently in his second season with Braintree Town.

GENE KENNEDY Recently joined on loan. A youth product of the Colchester United Academy since U10 level, Kennedy worked his way up through the youth categories at the club after joining from Kelvedon Hatch. He made his professional debut for Colchester in a 1–0 EFL Cup loss to Birmingham City on 10 August 2021. He made his English Football League debut for the club on 21 August 2021, coming off the bench in Colchester's 2–1 win at Oldham Athletic. Gene impressed whilst playing for Colchester against Braintree Town in the Essex Senior cup ¼ final tie.

JACK TURNER Joined on loan from Southampton until end of the season. Regular starter in PL2, and in EFL Trophy after recovering from Injury which hampered his start to the season. Ball playing midfielder who has impressed and has a bright future in the name.

CHRIS REGIS A former England under-17 international, he spent his youth career with Arsenal and Southampton, before he joined Colchester United in 2015. He left Colchester in January 2017 without making first-team appearance for the club, though he did have a loan spell at Maldon & Tiptree. He enjoyed brief stays at Sittingbourne and Farnborough, hefore he signed a six-month contract with Port Vale in November 2017. He returned to non-league football with Torquay United in July 2018, before moving on to Truro City via Wealdstone in the 2018-19 season. He later played for Coggeshall Town, Cambridge City, Barton Rovers, Chalfont St Peter and Braintree Town.

BRANDON NJOKU Recently joined on Work Experience loan from Cambridge United. The 18-year-old has displayed exceptional resilience during his recovery from injury at start of season, while his attitude off-the-pitch has caught the attention of his mentors and peers. On the pitch, Njoku has been instrumental in Cambridge United U18s FA Youth Cup run to the Quarter Finals, with goals against Portsmouth and Colchester to his name. Spent time on loan with St Neots Town and Cheshunt earlier this season

WILLIE CLEMONS Attacking Midfielder/
Winger who is a Full Senior Bermuda
International with over 25 Caps.
Previously played professional across
Eastern Europe/Scandinavia. Most
recently at Stowmarket Town FC and
Dalkurd FF. Entertaining, attacking
player, loves to enjoy the game and play
attractive football.

MATT RUSH 21 year old striker who can play anywhere across the front line. Joined Braintree at beginning of 2022/23 season from Southend United. Proven track record of both scoring and assisting with goals. Scored over 50 goals for Southend under 18's and 23's in a 12 month period earning him his first professional contract. Made his football league debut against Sunderland at The Stadium of Light, with his first football league goal scoring the winner against Levton Orient at Roots Hall, A local lad from Wickford in Essex where he spent his early teenage years playing for his local team Wickford Town.

ALFIE MATTHEWS Alfie progressed through the ranks at Arsenal where he was part of the youth team and trained with the first team. In 2020 Alfie left Arsenal and despite interest from Serie A & Northern Clubs opted to join Crystal Palace where he featured for the U23's. Alfie left Palace and during 2021-22 season joined Welling United. Alfie is a wholehearted player who is not afraid to get "Stuck In".

AARON BLAIR Started the season on loan with Braintree, scoring 5 goals in 7 matches, was recalled by parent club and hardly featured. Re-joined recently on loan from Dagenham & Redbridge. Before putting pen to paper with the Daggers, Blair spent his time playing for Ongar Town where he scored over 100 goals.

LAMAR REYNOLDS Joined Braintree in August 2022. Reynolds began his career with Barking, joining the club's youth academy at the age of 16. He later played for Thurrock, Aveley, Gravs Athletic, Heybridge Swifts & Brentwood Town. In June 2017, Reynolds was one of 42 players who attended the V9 Academy, After impressing scouts at the academy, Reynolds joined League Two side Newport County on a twoyear deal. On 2 July 2018, Reynolds ioined Dagenham & Redbridge on a free transfer, and subsequently joined Chelmsford City on loan. On 20 June 2019, he signed for National League South side Concord Rangers on a free transfer following his release from Dagenham

ALFIE PAVEY Forward who made the move to Braintree Town in February after leaving National League South side Dover Athletic. Always has been known to be a thorn in the opposition frequently scoring against Braintree. After spending his youth career with Maidstone, where he scored 300 goals in three years for the Stones' academy and youth sides, Pavey earned a move to Championship side Millwall. In his three years with the Lions, Pavey, had loan spells with Barnet, Bromley, Aldershot, Hampton and Richmond, and Dartford. Following a brief spell with Welling United, Pavey returned to Dartford, scoring 28 goals in 38 matches and winning the National League South Player of the Season award. He then joined promoted Havant & Waterlooville and scored four times in 19 appearances hefore making the move to Dover. He left Dover to sign for Barnet for an undisclosed fee in September 2019 before joining Maidstone in June 2021. Signed for Dover at start of 2022-23 season
